

HUYFC Managers' Code of Conduct 2009 - 2010

To comply with the HUYFC Code of Conduct, Managers / Coaches must:

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ensure that they, The Club and its officers comply with the 'Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act (SVGA) 2006' by;<ul style="list-style-type: none">- giving full details of themselves to the FA in a Criminal Records Bureau enhanced disclosure form via the club Child Welfare Officer.- ensuring that that the details [name address telephone number] of any person helping them with training or match days on a regular basis [twice in a month] are known to the club child welfare officer and the club secretary.• ensuring that any person helping them with training or match days on a regular basis [twice in a month] is aware that they must submit to a FA CRB check via the Club.• ensuring that they do not cause any person without a completed FA CRB check to be at any time during Club activity left unsupervised/unmonitored with Club members.• hold or attain the FA Level One coaching qualification (within 10 months if not held)• must be qualified first-aiders.• consistently display high standards of behaviour and appearance and act as a role model for players, parents and spectators.• respect the rights, dignity and worth of each and every person and treat them equally within the context of the sport.• place the well-being and safety of each player above all other considerations including the development of performance.• check and ensure that the playing area and all equipment are safe and fit for purpose before ever training or match event that they conduct.• adhere to all guidelines laid down by the constitution and governing bodies (The F.A., County F.A., N.E.H.Y.L. etc.).• develop an appropriate working relationship with each player based on mutual trust and respect.• encourage and guide players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• ensure that the activities they direct or advocate are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of players.• always be honest with players, parents and guardians. Clarify with them exactly what is expected of them and also what they are entitled to expect from their Manager / Coach.• co-operate fully with other specialists (e.g. other coaches, officials, doctors, physiotherapists) in the best interest of the player.• always promote the code of conduct and the positive aspects of the sport (e.g. fair play) to other coaches, players, parents and spectators alike. <p>Never condone violations of the Laws of the Game, or relevant rules and regulations, or the use of prohibited substances or techniques.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• always have a first aid kit available. Within this kit must be an up to date listing of each player's home / emergency telephone number, together with any known medical conditions as described in the player's completed HUYFC membership application form.• endeavour to attend the appropriate training courses as advised by the club committee.• promote ethical principles, avoiding all forms of gamesmanship.• pass on complaints regarding match officials to the club secretary, not deal with them personally.• encourage and praise the players at all times; never put unnecessary pressure on any player.• understand that players each have their own personalities and will respond differently.• refrain from smoking in the presence of players whilst conducting training sessions and match-day management of the team.• attend a minimum of 6 committee meetings per year.• not allow children not registered with the club to train or play with the Club• not use or tolerate inappropriate language.• not act as an official or unofficial scout for any other football club.• not exert undue influence to obtain personal benefit or reward.• not show favouritism towards players.
